



Dear friends.

For those who follow sports, what a relief it was to move swiftly on from the football to the Olympics. Stay-cationers were able to enjoy 'virtual' international travel, to Japan: a part of the world which not many of us get to. Even for those who don't much care for competitive sports, the broadening out of the Olympic menu means a veritable smorgasbord of things which we might happen to be more interested in, for example BMX, surfing and climbing. And the different time zone has made it possible to get a daily digest of events with a cup of morning tea at breakfast. Very civilised.

So hats off to Tokyo 2020 for pulling it together! And hats off to the competitors who have still managed to push themselves 'citius, altius, fortius', often with only a sparsely populated stadium behind them.

As a warm-up for our summer of armchair sport, my wife and I watched again one of our favourite films, Chariots of Fire, profiling Team GB at the Paris Olympics of 1924. There is an interesting contrast within the film as to what might motivate a sportsman. At one point the Englishman Harold Abrahams explains why winning the 100 metres meant so much to him: "When that gun goes off I have 10 seconds to justify myself." So here is a man who is utterly dependent on success on the athletics track for meaning and worth.

But the Scotsman Eric Liddell explains at a different moment in the film why he, as a Christian, wants to run: "God made me fast and when I run, I feel his pleasure." Here's a man, in stark contrast, who knows the approval of God. He is free from the burden of seeking glory in athletics, he's free from the burden of seeking the approval of others and that transforms his life.

There's great enjoyment to be had in watching and taking part in sport; but the greatest joy imaginable is to be found through knowing the smile of God on our life which comes from being friends with Jesus Christ. The One who made a Tom Daley and a Charlotte Worthington today (or Eric Liddell before them) with their amazing abilities – is also the One who made you and me (with our different gifts and talents) and who shed his blood so that we might be brought into loving relationship with God.

Good news: that relationship can be a constant for any of us: whatever the haul of medals and achievements in life and however big or small the crowd watching us...



You will remember we had a very interesting and concerning talk about the River Cam and chalk streams last month. England is home to 85% of the

World's chalk streams, and many of these are in our county. Our tap water comes from the chalk underground aquifer, which also feeds the Cam. So extracting water quicker than it can be replenished by winter rain has led to the river often running dry. The more new houses are built in the area, the more water-stressed the area will become. We can do our bit to preserve the aquifer level and quality of our streams by cutting our consumption.

The Cricket Club has been very busy since the last edition of *Around* Little Shelford. All of our teams have played many fixtures, largely escaping rain cancellations, we have had the new artificial strip installed, our Junior U15 side have progressed to the national competition having won their Cambridgeshire final and we have started a Soft Ball Cricket session on Saturday mornings over the school summer holidays.

Fantastic achievements by junior players in first full season

Our junior section only started last season, which was obviously much truncated. However, in our first full season our Juniors are going from strength to strength at all three levels under the watchful eyes and excellent coaching of lan Reid and Jamie Harrison.

SSYI Summer Update

As the restrictions have continued to lift Shelford & Stapleford Youth Initiative have been able to run more and more of our work in person.

- Our Girls' Group and RED group have continued to run in the Johnson Hall in Stapleford whilst the work carries on in our Youth Centre, alongside our regular detached sessions and 1:1 work.
- Monday Night Dinner was able to restart in person, meeting in the North Building at All Saints Little Shelford and we started two completely new groups in Sawston.
- A football group on a Monday evening on Lynton Way Recreation Ground and an open access group at Mill Lane Pavilion. These have been a great success with over 40 new young people signing up.
- We have been running a transition group for year 6's in one of the local primary schools and have done multiple assemblies in local schools both in person and virtually.

Our redevelopment work in our Youth Centre is almost complete, with the walls now insulated and plastered, the new suspended ceiling has been installed and painting is well underway. Once the flooring is done, we will be able to fit the new toilets and kitchen and get everything finished up and ready for use. It is going to be a fantastic space for young people to use, with a full-size pool table, a large air hockey table, projector, dart board, fully equipped kitchen and more!

This summer we have been holding multiple trips away with our young people, including a trip to Adrenaline Alley, the biggest indoor skatepark in Europe, a Zorb football session in Sawston, a trip to an Aqua Park and a trip to Great Yarmouth for games, rides and fish and chips! We are also taking around 20 young people away to Skreens Park in Chelmsford for a 3-day residential, doing various activities including kayaking, air rifle shooting and frisbee golf. For many of our young people these activities would usually be out of reach financially, so we are heavily subsidising them, if you would like to donate to support a young person in attending these trips please get in touch.

We hope that in September we will be able to run groups every weekday in the Youth Centre catering to young people of all ages and interests. Alongside continuing to run open access and sports groups in Sawston. Running SSYI and all that we do would not be possible without funding from local councils, churches, and individuals, we are profoundly grateful to all who support us.

East West Rail Update

Many thanks to all of those in the Village who took the time and trouble to look at the EWR proposals and submit a response by the 9th June deadline. We know from resident feedback that many responses to the consultation were submitted from Little Shelford with particular local concerns about the possible closure of the level crossing on Hauxton Road as well as the broader impact on South Cambridgeshire between Cambourne and the new Cambridge South Station.

There are rumours that EWR received over 30,000 responses to this second consultation though as of today the EWR web site has not published the number. In a press release on 10th June 2021 Simon Blanchflower CBE, Chief Executive at the East West Railway Company said:

"The participation in this consultation has been extraordinary, and we're very grateful to everyone who has taken the time to visit our virtual consultation rooms, attend a webinar or live chat event, and share their thoughts and views by sending a formal response. Later this year, a report will be published providing information on all the issues raised in

this consultation. EWR Co will carefully consider all the feedback as it continues to develop plans for the railway and will then make its recommendations to the Government. A statutory consultation is expected next year when communities will be asked to give their comments on detailed proposals".

We now are waiting to see what happens next. In the meantime, at the Village Show on 18 September, the Parish Council will have a stall to share information and a detailed display on EWR and the impact on the Shelfords. Please do use this as an opportunity to understand fully what EWR plans and the impact of their preferred southern route. Our MP, District, County and Parish Councillors will also be present so you will have chance to air your views.

New signs for Blennies Patch (Allotments and the Community Orchard) Blennies Patch is the land owned by the Parish Council at the end of Garden Fields. It is where the village allotments are located, and it is also where SCOWP have been developing the community orchard. The uptake of allotments during lock-down has been significant and the allotments are blooming at the moment. The work of SCOWP has also continued successfully during the year with additional tree and hedge planting and hay making.

The success of SCOWP has also meant the number of villagers accessing the orchard and Blennies Patch for recreation has sharply increased, including dog walkers. Unfortunately, this has also led to increasing problems with litter and unbagged dog poo! As a result the Parish Council will shortly be installing a litter and dog poo bin on the path to the orchard to encourage walkers of all types (2 legged and four legged) to put their litter in the bin. We have also decided that in the Blennies Patch area all dogs should be kept on lead. This is because, the orchard is attracting much more wildlife, including ground nesting birds, there will shortly be horses in the third paddock and the amount of long grass in the paddock makes it difficult for even responsible dog owners to keep track on their dogs' behaviour and finally we want to orchard to be a very safe place for families and children and the amount of uncollected dog poo amongst the long grass is a threat to this. We hope villagers and will appreciate the specific reasons for this.

Finally, we also wanted to make sure villagers understand that the allotment area is for allotment holders and their guests only and is not for public access. The new signs highlight this.

Shelford School

It is certainly true to say that it has been a very different year to normal, with many changes such as class bubbles, virtual collective worship and periods of home schooling. However, the school has worked incredibly hard throughout the year to try to minimise the impact on the children's learning, as well as on their mental health. The school should feel very proud of everything that they have achieved in the past year.

The school is currently applying for reaccreditation of the International School Award. Evidence to support this is being put together, including demonstrating how well international work is now embedded in all aspects of the curriculum in the school.

International Day was celebrated at the start of July. Each class explored the culture and tradition of a particular country through a variety of activities. The highlight of the day for every class was a bespoke dance workshop, exploring traditional dances from their country.

All of the children enjoyed a great variety of activities such as hurdles, shotput, javelin and shuttle runs. Key Stage 2 children also took part in the traditional dash races. The children were keen to earn



points for their Houses but the staff also reported a great team spirit and sportpersonship which is wonderful to hear. Sadly parents were unable to watch but the school have shared photos and videos on the school vlog. This demonstrates one of the many ways that the school has helped parents to remain connected whilst so many restrictions are in place.
