from Rev Simon Scott Rector of Little Shelford



Dear friends,

'God save the King!'

I expect I will always be able to remember when I sung those words for the first time: around 12 Noon, on 11 September 2022, the Sunday following the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The accession proclamation for King Charles III had by then been made and to sing the National Anthem for him was entirely appropriate.

But it isn't easy to alter the habit of a lifetime! I had felt that it would be tough without the new wording written down in front of us to expect children to sing the National Anthem in our church's Family Service and make the necessary change from 'her' to 'him', even if they managed the more straightforward switch from 'Queen' to 'King'.

Of course for some of us this is a return to a version of the song which they have sung before. The National Anthem dates back originally to the 17th century; it eventually became a popular hit in the wake of the Jacobite rebellion in 1745. The Royal Theatres in London resounded to this song, on the lips of supporters loyal to King George II. And the future of the Anthem was secured.

Back to our own times... Later on Sunday 11 September, our Parish Council Chair, Andrew Hawthorn, taking the role of town crier, finished his reading of the Accession Proclamation with the same resounding declaration: 'God save the King'. It was wonderful to be part of a small crowd repeating the prayer.

In fact the words are drawn originally from the Bible – Words based on the King James Bible text of 1 Kings Chapter 1, originally spoken in connection with King Solomon, have been sung at every coronation since that of King Edgar in 973AD:

'And all the people rejoic'd, and said: "God save the King! Long live the King! May the King live for ever, Amen".

I understand the sentence even became a watchword in the Navy for a time: 'God save the King' was the coded password, answered by 'Long may He reign'.

You won't be surprised at the parish priest taking the opportunity to call us all to join together in prayer for the God who reigns over all to bless, strengthen and save the new King. In fact, it is a prayer we could all do well to pray for our village, our families, and even ourselves. But let's make a start with this: 'God save the King!'

24/7 Prescription Collection Points

With our 24/7 prescription collection points, you can pick up your repeat prescriptions on a day and at a time that suits you – even when our dispensaries are closed. You can collect day or night, weekends and bank holidays.

Where can I find the collection points?

We have 24/7 collection points at Granta Sawston and Granta Linton, and have just installed a new one at Granta Shelford.

How do they work?

- Order your prescriptions from your surgery in the usual way. 1.
- When your medicines are ready to collect you will receive a text on 2. your mobile phone with a unique collection pin.
- Simply type the pin number into the machine and pay any charges 3. via card (if you pay for prescriptions) and the machine will dispense vour medication.

Are there items that cannot be collected from a 24/7 collection point?

There are some items the collection points cannot be used for, for clinical or regulatory reasons. These include:-

- Controlled drugs like morphine and oxycodone
- Drugs that need to be stored in a fridge •
- Very large bulky items

More ways to manage your repeat prescriptions

The 24/7 collection points add to the range of ways you can now access your medications - direct at the dispensary counter, in the comfort of your own home with our free home delivery service, and now at a date/ time of your choice.

Green Groups in the Shelfords, Stapleford & Sawston (2G3S)



The talk on 5 September, 'Heat Pumps Explained' by Warren Pope, from Peterborough Environment City Trust, gave a wealth of information and links to companies supplying equipment. For a full set of his slides see our website. Basically, he stressed that if you decide to go for a heat pump, use a MCS certified installer, and ensure their proposals meet the design spec MIS 3005 – that is a guarantee that their proposals will keep you warm and work well. He gave us details about costs, longevity, and space needed outside and inside the house for equipment. He suggested alternative low energy heating solutions, such as Warmstone, Laminaheat, and infrared heaters. He also discussed hybrid systems, such as a heat pump, topped up with another energy source for very cold weather. He advised that as the cost of electricity was high and very volatile at present it may be best to wait awhile before installing a pump system, but that in the meantime it makes sense to insulate your home and to install solar PV if you can. That way you will save money on your energy bills and save carbon emissions, whatever energy source you use. Then if the electricity prices settle you can decide about a heat pump.

The **Repair Café** on 10 September, as part of Great Shelford Free Church's Eco Festival, was very busy. Why don't you bring along your broken electricals, household items, jewellery, pieces of clothing, etc to the next Café, and get a repair done for the price of a small donation rather than having to buy new? Future Repair Café dates are listed below, also details of how to book a repair slot. Plus there's coffee and cake while you wait!
