from Rev Simon Scott Rector of Little Shelford



Dear friends,

'Everything everywhere all at once' (with no commas to provide even a moment's pause) isn't just a good name for an Oscar-winning film. I often have the sense that it's a motto describing my own life. If only it was as simple as moving quickly from one thing to another – and then on to the next thing and the next thing and the next. My problem is that like the proverbial plate-spinner, I have the sense that everything is happening at once and I have to be in fourteen different places giving my attention to a gazillion competing situations and people.

Part of the film's appeal, I guess, is that many of us feel that pressure – whether from our work, from our family relationships, or from our financial burdens. The film hints that we all inhabit not a universe but a multi-verse, with different parallel dimensions and possibilities layered throughout our lives. Choose the good version of the story and run with that one – for your own sake and for the defeat of the evil powers!

Perhaps that choice only loads us with further pressure, to do the right thing. So as Easter approaches again, I am very thankful that I don't have to be the hero. The message of Easter is that Jesus Christ has come right into the mess of our world – which often appears chaotic or overshadowed by evil powers.

There is a lovely description of Jesus Christ in the Bible as the 'friend of sinners'. In other words he doesn't expect us to have our lives together, before he will have anything to do with us. Instead he comes right into our world, the real world where we live, with all the brokenness and wrong choices which each and every one of us has made.

He isn't a friend only of super-saints, but of sinners. Which is why he died on the cross on Good Friday and why the resurrection of Easter Day is a pointer towards such hope for the future. He comes to us all where we are – which is why the church, in his name, offers a welcome to everyone, whatever their background or their past. He comes in friendship to us, in whatever situation he finds us; but equally, he leaves none of us as he finds us, inviting us all to a transformed existence and a different end to our lives' stories.

Please join us at our services and special events – and become part of the adventure with us of knowing Jesus Christ as the best friend it is possible to have.

Great and Little Shelford Primary School

This year, Great and Little Shelford CofE Primary School is introducing a new Science Prize in memory of former teacher, Mike Paduano. The Prize will be awarded to a pupil for progress in Science and will be given out in the summer term each year, alongside the Philippa Pearce Prize for English and the new Ada Lovelace Prize for Maths.

Mike Paduano taught at Shelford for 25 years. Members of the current School Council remember fondly his enthusiastic and engaging science lessons. One former pupil remembers how she came home inspired to grow her own crystals after one of his lessons.

As a colleague, Mike was always supportive of others. He always went above and beyond: opening the school at the weekend for PTA events, helping with swimming pool maintenance, caring for the wildlife garden and even building a vegetable patch at the bottom of the school field. Mike gave every class different seeds to grow and then helped the children to plant, care for and harvest their produce.

As one teacher at the school, recalls:

The school holds many happy memories of working with Mike. He was particularly helpful when I started in Year 3 and had to research the history of the school. Alison Evans told me that Mike was the best person to speak with and he took me on a detailed tour of the site, explaining the configuration of the 2 original Victorian cottages and how the various buildings had developed from there. He was extremely knowledgeable and brought the history to life. I still take each year 3 class on the same route that Mike took me, pointing out the same features, but leaving out his robust views on the Victorian building material, clunch!'

For many years, Mike was in charge of the annual May Pole dancing and the complicated dance moves he helped Year 6 students to undertake were very impressive.

In his teaching, he used real-life and practical opportunities to help children learn, even opening the bonnet of a colleague's Morris Minor to show his class how the engine worked!

His fall into the lake at Grafham Water on the Year 6 residential trip has gone down in school history, but every year, he made the trip memorable for his students.

He was incredibly knowledgeable and a whole generation of children in Great and Little Shelford were lucky to have him teach and inspire them.

EXCHANGE VISITS 2023

We are delighted to be arranging visits again GREAT & LITTLE SHELFORD - VERNEUIL-EN-HALATTE after the pandemic. 2023 marks the 35th anniversary of the beginning of the Shelfords' twinning link with Verneuil-en-Halatte, a village situated about 30 miles north of Paris. The date of this year's visit to Verneuil is:



Shelford to Verneuil: Thurs 1 – Sun 4 June

Cost: Adults £95* Children £75* (second and subsequent children £50*)

The fare includes all travel, accommodation and meals (the only other expenses being a small gift for the host family, lunches on the days of travel, a little pocket money and your travel insurance for the four days). Travel is by coach from Great Shelford (channel crossing by tunnel).

The visit is for all, adults and children. The people in Verneuil are welcoming and friendly, and everyone is accommodated in families as the essence of twinning is getting to know each other on a personal level. Children of primary school age are especially catered for. The programme includes outings to places of interest, a morning in school for primary age children, and a party for all. It is not necessary to be able to speak French, but it's nice to try!

U-14s must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

GRANTA Medical Practices Granta Medical Practices Update, April 2022

From 1 April 2023, Royston Health Centre (RHC) will be part of Granta Medical Practices (GMP). The practices are coming together to build on the existing practice strengths, pooling clinical and administrative teams to offer greater resilience and a wider choice of services for our patients. The aim of this is to provide a more stable model for delivering care within Royston and the surrounds.

Both GMP and RHC have been sharing their values and commitment to high quality clinical care over the past year and a full merger helps provide improved access and choice for our patients. The same doctors, practice nurses and staff will still be at RHC and you will still be able to see your chosen doctor as usual. For GMP patients, you will now have another surgery to choose from, should you wish to.

For the most part, patients of GMP and RHC should not notice any difference. There will be a slight delay in merging the computer systems (currently estimated around the end of April) but after that any GMP patient may be seen at a GMP surgery of their choice. If there are any specific changes or additions to services we will of course let you know. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to contact us via the GMP website <u>www.grantamedicalpractices.co.uk</u> or feel free to call in.

Bring along your broken item and a skilled volunteer will help you fix it. They can tackle a wide variety of repairs, typically including clothes and fabrics, electrical items, jewellery and other items.

No Mow May and Bloomin' June

If you have a lawn and wish to help our wildlife this Summer, consider giving the lawn mower a rest to allow wildflowers to develop during May, then let it 'bloom in June'. You may be surprised at the number of nectar-producing plants that appear, such as orchids, to the benefit of bees which are important pollinators for our food plants. The Plantlife charity initiated the 'No Mow May' scheme and their web site gives more details, including the improvements to biodiversity.

Note it's important to remove the cuttings after the flowering season so a thatch does not build up to suppress more delicate plants. Also to make the area look tidy, keep a neat edge around the site by conventional mowing, or maybe mow a path through? Look up No Mow May on the internet, or to find out biodiversity gains in detail look at plantlife.org.uk/uk/about-us/news/no-mow-may-how-to-get -ten-times-more-bees-on-your-lockdown-lawn. Shelford Community Orchard and Woodland Project (SCOWP)

The Jubilee Orchard at Blennie's Patch

Thankfully we have had very few losses in the orchard, despite the very cold snaps we have had, and it is gratifying to see slight stirrings of Spring!

Since September a large portion of the paddock to the left of the existing orchard, as approached from Garden Fields, has been turned over to SCOWP and will be developed over the coming years. So far it has been mown mechanically, being far too large an area and the grass too overgrown for scything.



Seven new standard trees have been planted and new paths will be established and maintained. This new land has approximately doubled our meadow area and we're excited to have a new project! We hope to investigate sustainable planting which will reflect how the climate is changing.

Open ArmS In Shelfords and Stapleford (OASISS) Seeking ongoing homes for our Ukrainian guests

As the war in Europe continues, we have over 100 Ukrainians enriching our small villages. Of these, about a third have secured homes independently from their hosts and a few are risking return to Ukraine. There remain about 50 established guests who are seeking accommodation in the villages because they have children in nearby schools; another move would be very traumatic, and **rematching** is an option if willing hosts can be found.

We are seeking for housing for these individuals and families, which could take several forms, but we are asking you all:

Have you considered taking an individual or family for a period of 6 months? Almost all our hosts have found this a rewarding experience, but some feel (after 6 months to a year) that they would like to 'reclaim' their homes. The government and the County Council provide £500 monthly for welcoming Ukrainian guests in your home.

Do you have a rental property that you could offer to a Ukrainian family? The government and SCDC is making this easier in several ways: the government will pay rent according to need under the Universal Credit scheme, there are also discretionary payments available to help with rental payments; if needed, SCDC will pay the deposit and will pay up to a maximum of one month's rent in advance direct to the landlord. Please consider this before putting it with an agent.

We have had requests from Ukrainians still in Ukraine with a link to others already in our community, all from the most war-torn areas:

- A mother and teenage daughter, the daughter has been awarded a place at a 6th form college in Cambridge
- A mother and her 3 year-old, the mother a great friend of our Ukrainian English-language teacher
- A mother and her two daughters
- A grandmother, her daughter and her grandson
